Scorching* temperatures, noisy cicadas* and plenty of handkerchiefs: Those are the things that come to mind when I think of a summer in Japan. I'm already starting to prepare myself for the summer heat.

Growing up in a cold climate, I was used to harsh and sometimes bitterly cold winters. Beautiful summers felt like a (A) for enduring all that snow and ice.

But for me, summer in Japan is the toughest time of the year. After five summers here, I still haven't gotten used to the weeks and weeks of hot, humid* weather. (1)Canadians just aren't built for it.

Thankfully, however, I have some strategies to survive.

The first thing I started doing is treating summer in Japan like I used to treat winter in Canada.

Other than some fun outdoor activities like skiing or skating on frozen lakes and ponds, winter in Canada is best spent indoors, ideally with a good book and a hot cup of coffee. There's also plenty of hockey on TV and it's a good time to catch up on home projects you've neglected over the busy summer months.

So during summer in Japan, I mostly try to do the same sorts of things. Because I telework, I can usually avoid peak daytime temperatures and instead go for walks in the morning or evening when it's a little bit cooler. I read, study and watch as much baseball as I can. I also try to plan activities out of the house that involve air conditioning, like visits to a museum or an indoor playground for my daughter.

Still, I don't want to be cooped up indoors all summer either, and that's where preparation becomes extra important.

Handkerchiefs, battery-powered fans and breathable* clothes are essential.

Last year, I actually attended the Koshien tournament with my father-in-law. It was four games in stifling* August heat and the only (B) came from the occasional beer and a huge air conditioner near the washroom. By the third game, the mall* next to the stadium started to look like an oasis in the desert, but unfortunately re-entry* is not permitted after leaving Koshien.

Thankfully my father-in-law knew we'd need a break from the heat, so instead of buying two tickets for himself and me, he bought four. So in the middle of a 35-degree afternoon, we staggered out of* Koshien, spent an hour or two having lunch at the mall, then returned for the final game of the day.

So while I'm not looking forward to summer, I can say that I'm prepared for it.

And after all, October is only a few short months away.
